In a pairing that began in 1561, this paraphrase of Psalm 100 by a Scot is set to a tune that French composer originally created for Psalm 134 in the Genevan Psalter of 1551. They have appeared together in nearly every comprehensive English-language hymnal since then. You might recognize the tune, OLD HUNDREDTH as the same tune commonly used for the Doxology.
