We are humbled that you love us and draw near to us, God of power and might. In the name of Christ our Savior, we pray the prayer he taught, saying together:

Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our debts, as we forgive our debtors. Lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil.
