Pastor:

We pray that you might speak to us. We pray that your Word might dwell within us and be engraved upon our hearts. We pray for the right words to speak in troubled times. We pray that your Spirit might give us eyes to see and hearts to hear the new Word you are still speaking today.

We pray for wonder and awe. We pray that beyond our hope and imagination, you might bring peace to war-torn lands. We pray that we might see your fingerprints in our own.

Finally, we pray for all those needs unnamed that trouble and unsettle our souls, needs known to you and bigger than we can handle on our own.

Into your hands, O Lord, we place these prayers, longing for the day when you will make all things new. As we wait with anticipation and hope, we join our voices with disciples of all the ages to pray as Jesus has taught us,
