This show reflects other windows in our Sanctuary: The apostles and the chancel windows depicting the life of Christ. TODAY'S CHOIR MUSIC

Introit: African-American spirituals like this one have obscure backgrounds—it's unknown who created them or when. "He Is King of Kings" has a typical call and response form, with a repeated message that "no one works like Him." Verses were often invented spontaneously, and these songs by enslaved people were usually sung a capella (without instruments).

Anthem: Contemporary composer Dan Forrest has set this text to his original but very traditional sounding American tune. Exalting God our "almighty King" is appropriate for this Christ the King Sunday, which was established by Pope Pius XI in 1925.
