Music Notes

Today's hymn, *Praise Ye the Lord, the Almighty*, was a German hymn tune and text created by Joachim Neander in 1680, shortly before J. S. Bach was born. It wasn't translated into English until 1863, and found its way into most Protestant hymnals, both for its adaptation of Psalm 150 and for its stirring, memorable tune.

It Is Well With My Soul, was born out of tragic grief. Its Presbyterian author, Horatio Spafford, had sent his wife and four daughters off to Paris from New York in 1876; their ship sank, and only his wife survived. This testament to faith and future was set that same year to a tune that was named for that ship, the Ville Du Havre.
